Reflection

May is the month of Mary. Why is May Mary's month? The month of May is the month in which we dedicated to our Mother Mary, it is an occasion where Catholics all over the world pay respect to the Queen of Heaven. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of the Church and therefore is a guide and inspiration to all. Mary lived in faith as the scripture reminds us to.

The Catholic Church, for centuries honours Mary during the entire month of May. This tradition goes back as far as Ancient Greeks. In Ancient Rome, May was dedicated to Flora the Goddess of blossoms. In medieval times, the 1st of May was seen as the start of new growth. During this period, the Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary came about. The idea of a month dedicated to Mary goes back to baroque times, even though it wasn't during May, it included thirty daily spiritual exercises that honoured Mary. During this time, Mary's Month and May were combined, with special devotions occurring throughout the month. This tradition became widespread during the nineteenth century and still occurs today.
