Classroom News

Miss Coles (Early Years)

This Term we have been very busy in the Early Years Classroom. We have Pre-Kindy up and running again, which has been fantastic. The farm theme has been a hit! The children have been working on their oral language and social skills as they role play different animals and share the resources available. The children have also been loving the mud kitchen and the water tap. They have made waterfalls, rivers and cities. It's been great to see them problem solve, think about how the water moves and work collaboratively.

In English, we have been focusing on the text "Jack and the Beanstalk". We have discussed the characters, the main events and have begun learning about punctuation. We have also been revising our initial sound knowledge and are beginning to apply this to reading and writing.

In Maths, we have been working on our subitising and counting skills, as well as measuring. At the beginning of term, we planted a bean just like Jack and the Beanstalk and we have been watching it change and grow. We are also filling out a bean diary each week where we measure how tall it is.

In Religion, we have been focusing on the unit "Special Me" where we have explored how God made us all unique. We have discussed what makes us special and how we can use our special gifts to help others. We even learnt a song about being special - ask your child to sing it to you!

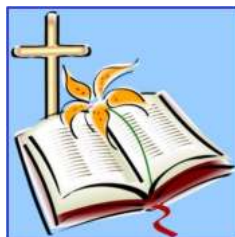

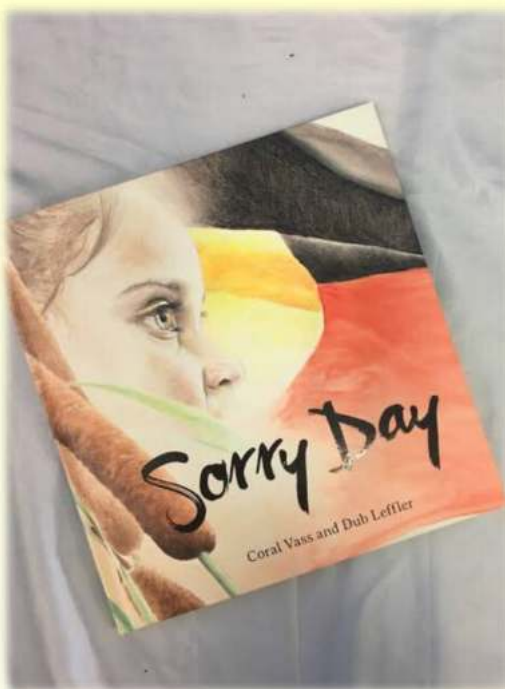

NATIONAL SORRY DAY 2020

On Tuesday, 26th May, St Joseph's School participated in activities to commemorate National Sorry Day. The Year 3-6 students started the day by reading "Sorry Day", by Coral Vass and Dub Leffler.

To explain the concept of Sorry Day, students drew pictures of their families, their memories and where they live. Students were then asked to rip their picture up into tiny pieces. It was then explained that this is how the Aboriginal people would have felt when they were ripped away from their families. All of their memories and their families would never be the same. This was followed by a range of activities relating to the Aboriginal culture.
