As committee chair it makes my job easy knowing we have the constant support of our wonderful families. 2023 has been full of many fundraisers and events supported by all.

The year started off with welcoming our semester 1 principal David Hamersley, who kindly shared with us his musically abilities-- singing and playing guitar at our Back-to-School Sundowner. It was a lovely night, that saw all our families come together for a picnic and chance to get to know each other. The kids were busy games, and even singing a bit of karaoke. We hope to make this an annual event and kick off 2024 again with food, friends and more musical entertainment! Semester one fundraisers included Chocolate box sales that profited \$1560.70, Mother's Day stall that profited \$58.13 and the Disco which profited \$443.70. I would like thank all our parents and staff that were involved with helping the Disco run smoothly. It was the first time our P&F has hosted a disco solely on our own and it was a great night. We provided dinner, drinks, lolllies and the biggest success of the night--- light up toys! We hope to have another disco in 2024, and make it bigger and better! The term ended with our last fundraiser, which was providing afternoon tea for the Southern Cross Football Club.
